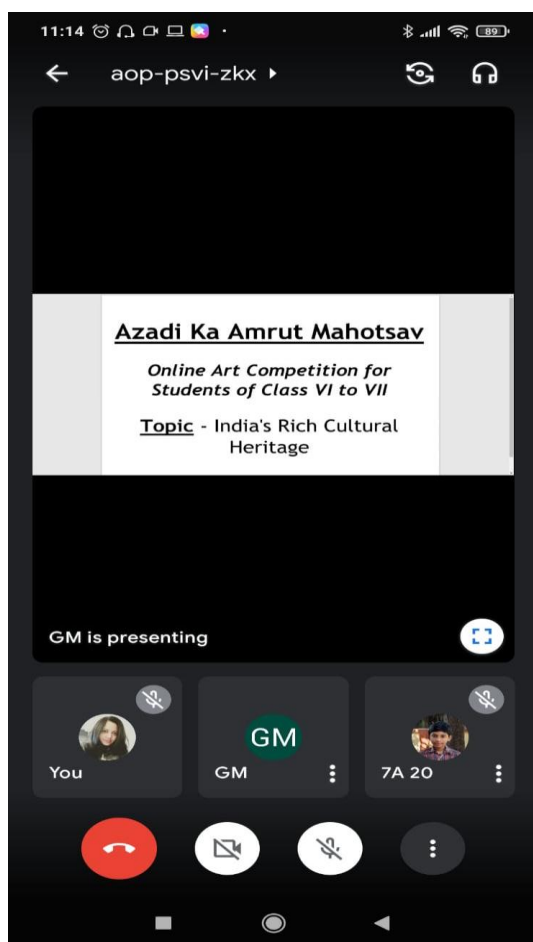


AZADI KA AMRUT MAHOTSAV

1. BCCL

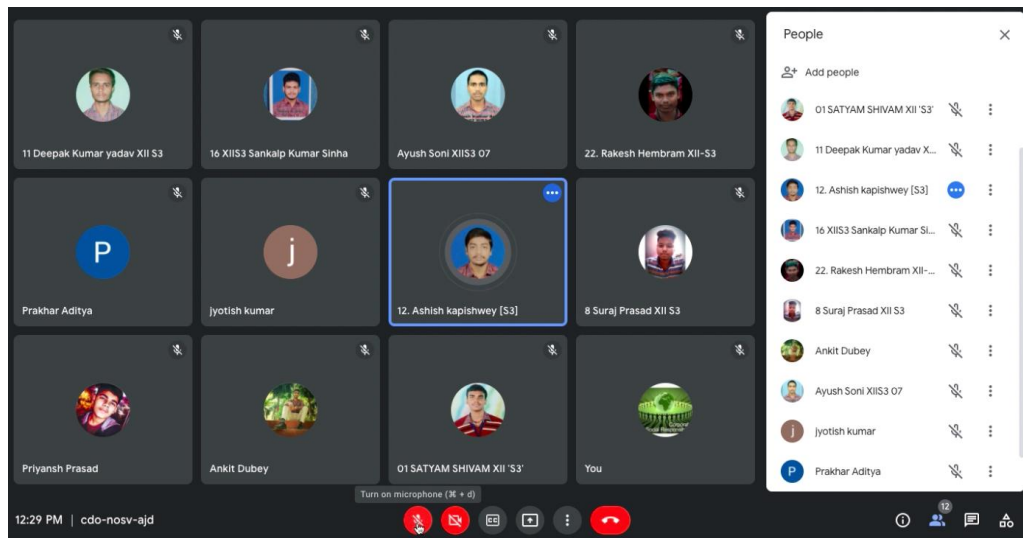

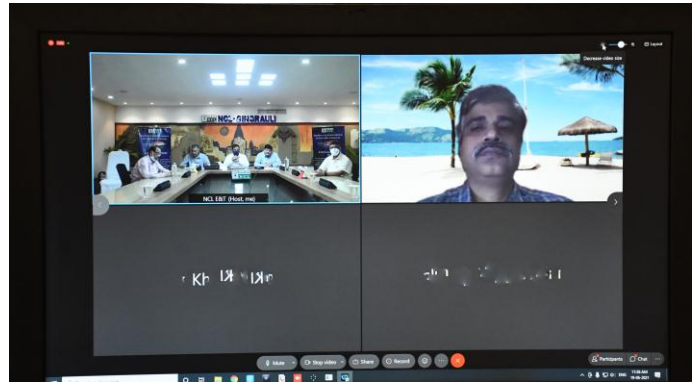

5. NCL

Covid-19 Mega Vaccination drive for SCCL Employees

The 14th Week of Bharat Ka Amrut Mahotsav was scheduled for “**Conducting rallies (Cycle/walk) by students**” in period between 13.06.2021 to 19.06.2021, but the above activity was changed as “**Covid-19 Mega Vaccination to SCCL Employees**”. The change in schedule is due to prevailing Covid-19 pandemic situations. The aim of the vaccination drive is 100% vaccination to SCCL employees.

The above program was inaugurated by Sri. N Balaram IRS, Director (Finance), (P&P) & (P.A&W) at Bellampalli Region. Sri S. Chandrashekar, Director (Op) inaugurated the programme at RG Region and Sri D. Satyanarayana Rao Director (E&M) at BHPL Area.
