I am enclosing herewith the monthly report in respect of Ministry of Coal for the month of April, 2019:

- Overall coal production of CIL has grown from 44.9 MT to 45.3 MT i.e. a growth of 1% as compared to the corresponding month of last year.
- Overall coal offtake of CIL was 51.0 MT as compared to 52.4 MT i.e. a growth of 2.6 % as compared to the corresponding month of last year.
- Coal dispatch by CIL to Power Sector as a whole increased from 40.3 MT to 40.7 MT, an increase of 1 % as compared to the corresponding month of last year.
- Outstanding dues by Power Sector to CIL as on 30.04.2019 were Rs. 9,908.00 crores.

(I) Promotional Drilling: A programme of Promotional/NMET (Regional) drilling comprising 1.18 lakh meters in coal and 0.35 lakh meters in lignite has been drawn up in Annual Plan 2019-20 of CMPDI. The programme is under execution by MECL, DGMs of Nagaland & Assam and CMPDI.

As against this, the achievement of drilling upto the month of April, 2019 is 0.096 lakh metre, against the target of 0.095 lakh metre, which is 101% of the target and registering a growth of 2% over the same period last year.

(m) Overall Progress of Detailed Drilling in 2018-19: For 2019-20, a target of 13.75 lakh metre of drilling (Departmental: 5.00 lakh metre, Outsourcing: 8.75 lakh metre) has been envisaged. As against this, 1.10 lakh metre of drilling has been carried out upto the month of April, 2019 against the target of 0.89 lakh metre, which is 124% of the target.

ii) Work for further construction of 3024 no. of flats at mouza Bijohnagar & Daskeary has been awarded to Simplex Infrastructures Ltd. on 19.03.2018 at an amount of Rs. 189.98 Crs. with schedule time of completion by 13.06.2019. Construction activity has already been started. **Though provision of blocks as per DPR was 124 but till date construction of 93 blocks are in progress at mouza Bijohnagar and that of mouza Daskeary out of the proposed blocks of 65 till date construction of 33 blocks are in progress** as informed by Housing Department, Govt. of WB.

iii) Work order for further construction of 1904 no. of flats (in 119 blocks) at mouza Namokeshiahas been awarded to Bridge & Roof (India) Ltd. on 19.03.2018 at an amount of Rs. 123.25 Crs. with schedule time of completion by 18.03.2019. Initially construction activity at the said resettlement site was suspended due to resistance of local people but after the intervention of Dist. Administration pre-construction activity was started from 25.07.2018 under police protection. Again, work has been suspended from August 2018 due to agitation of local people and to maintain law and order State authority has decided temporarily stoppage of construction activity on the said land/mouza till amicable solution is received at through meeting with local people/villagers as informed by Housing Department, Govt. of WB.
