**Promotional Drilling :** In Annual Plan 2016-17, a target of 1.75 lakh meter of Promotional drilling (0.90 lakh meter in coal and 0.85 lakh meter in lignite) had been envisaged. As against this, the achievement of drilling upto the month of October, 2016 is 0.58 lakh meter, against the target of 0.85 lakh meter.

**Overall Progress of Detailed Drilling in 2016-17:** For 2016-17, a target of 11.0 lakh meter of drilling (Departmental: 4.0 lakh meter, Outsourcing: 7.0 lakh meter) has been envisaged. As against this, 5.20 lakh meter of drilling has been carried out upto the month of October, 2016, against the target of 5.44 lakh meter.
