**(l) Promotional Drilling:** A programme of Promotional/NMET (Regional) drilling comprising 1.18 lakh meters in coal and 0.35 lakh meters in lignite has been drawn up in Annual Plan 2019-20 of CMPDI. The programme is under execution by MECL, DGMs of Nagaland & Assam and CMPDI.

As against this, the achievement of drilling upto the month of September, 2019 is 0.71 lakh metre, against the target of 0.61 lakh metre, which is 116% of the target and registering a growth of 30% over the same period last year.

**(m) Overall Progress of Detailed Drilling in 2019-20:** For 2019-20, a target of 14.00 lakh metre of drilling (Departmental: 5.05 lakh metre, Outsourcing: 8.95 lakh metre) has been envisaged. As against this, 5.50 lakh metre of drilling has been carried out upto the month of September, 2019 against the target of 5.29 lakh metre, which is 104% of the target.
